The Weekend Crisis Intervention Worker ensures a secure, empowering environment for shelter residents and outreach clients so they have the opportunity to create realistic plans regardless of the client's physical, mental, spiritual or emotional situation; provides crisis intervention and emergency shelter services in accordance with NWC policies and procedures and all applicable laws, by-laws, rules, regulations and Acts pertaining to emergency shelter services; acts as a support system to the women, answers crisis calls and provides the needed crisis intervention; maintains an appropriate professional relationship while working as an effective member of the NWC team.

College diploma in social work or a combination of post-secondary diploma in a related field and two years work related experience working in an emergency shelter or social work environment. Knowledge and understanding of women's issues specifically but not limited to Aboriginal family violence, violence against women, cycle of violence/power and control, women in conflict with the law, chronic homelessness, harm reduction model.
