The Relief Crisis Intervention Worker ensures a secure, empowering environment for shelter residents; provides crisis intervention and emergency shelter services (client assessments, intakes, plans of care, resource support, discharges) in accordance with NWC policies and procedures and all applicable laws, by-laws, rules, regulations and Acts pertaining to emergency shelter services; acts as a support system to single homeless women, and women and their children fleeing from violence; answers crisis calls and provides the needed crisis intervention; conducts some housekeeping duties throughout the shift to ensure a clean and safe work environment, maintains an appropriate professional relationship while working as an effective member of the NWC team.
